### **REOPENING OF THE SCHOOL FOR THE ACADEMIC SESSION 25–26**

The Al Ameen campus became active and lively with the cheerful presence of our students on 2nd June 2025. Our tiny tots were welcomed into the world of education and knowledge in a festive atmosphere on 9th June 2025. On the same day, Class XI students joined the campus to fulfil their dreams and aspirations.

### **SCHOLASTIC ACHIEVEMENTS**

I am glad to report that the students of SSCE and SSE 2024–25 brought laurels to the school with excellent results, achieving a 100% pass percentage. In Class X, out of 29 students who appeared, 27 students secured Distinction and 2 secured First Class. Kum. Hessa Hazeed stood first with 93%. Master A. Kailasnath scored 100/100 in Social Science.

In Class XII, all 25 students secured Distinction. Master Muhammad Afzal T. N. stood first with 98.8% with full A1 in the Science stream and scored centum in Physics, Chemistry and Computer Science. Master Kevin Ouseph Shibu stood first with 96.2% in the Commerce stream and scored centum in Accountancy. Master Afnan A. K. secured full A1 and scored centum in Physics and Chemistry. Kum. Ananya Harilal and Master

Pranav Vinod secured A1 in all subjects. Kum. Amana Almas M. S. scored centum in Chemistry, and Master Akhil Sabu scored centum in Physics.

Our school received the Alive Award instituted by the MLA of Aluva Constituency for achieving a 100% result in the Board Examinations. The Academic Excellence Award was received from a renowned educationist by five topper students of our school at a ceremony organised by Kochi Metro Sahodaya. DGP P. Vijayan honoured our school for securing a 100% result in the Class XII Board Examination 2024–25 conducted by Malayala Manorama. Our A1 holders received the Ernakulam District Panchayat Award at Al Ameen Public School, Edappally.

With immense pleasure, I would like to announce that our school has been selected as a centre for conducting the Class X and XII Board Examinations 2026.

### **SCHOOL PARLIAMENT ELECTION AND INVESTITURE CEREMONY**

“Leadership is the capacity to translate vision into reality.” The School Parliament provides students with an opportunity to participate in decision-making and develop leadership skills. Meet-the-candidate sessions were organised on 23rd, 24th and 25th June. The School Parliament Election was held on 27th June, in which students of Classes V to XII cast their votes through the ballot system. Master Abdhul Nihal P. S. of Class XII and Kum. Fathima Zaira V. S. of Class XII were elected as Head Boy and Head Girl respectively.

The Sports Captain, Sports Vice-Captain, House Prefects and Assistant House Prefects of the four houses—C. V. Raman House, Homi Bhabha House, J. C. Bose House and Vikram Sarabhai House—were also elected on the same day. The Investiture Ceremony was held on 2nd July, during which our Manager, Dr. Shefeek Rahman, presented badges and scrolls to the elected leaders.

### **KALOTSAV 2024**

The School Youth Kalotsav, RAINBOW 2025, was held over two consecutive days on 18th and 19th July and was filled with fun, talent, creativity and learning. The event was inaugurated by Dr. Shefeek Rahman, our School Manager. It was conducted house-wise, and winners were awarded trophies and certificates. Along with this, every day we are conducting class wise assembly for the students of class IV to XII, and various opportunities are being provided to develop and exhibit their talents. Homi Bhabha House was adjudged the Best House with 290 points, followed by Vikram Sarabhai House with 272 points.

From 4th October to 11th, 105 students participated in the CBSE Metro Sahodaya Kalotsav held at Sacred Heart CMI Public School, Thevara. We secured 519 points and stood 12th out of 65 schools. Our students won 1<sup>st</sup> prize in Thiruvathira, Duffmuttu, and Kolkali in Common group items and secured II<sup>nd</sup> prize in Oppana. In category wise

competition Kum. Nakshathra Satheesh got 1<sup>st</sup> prize in Mimicry (category III) and Kum. Aamina Parvin P A got 2<sup>nd</sup> prize in Arabic Recitation and 3<sup>rd</sup> prize in Mappilappattu (Category III). Kum Zahwa M N got 3<sup>rd</sup> prize in Pencil Drawing (Category II), Ku. Jasmine Jose got 3<sup>rd</sup> prize in Versification Malayalam (Category III) and Kum Riya Khan P S got 3<sup>rd</sup> prize in Recitation Arabic (Category IV).

In State Kalotsav held at Labour India Public School Marangattuppilly Kum. Nakshathra got 2<sup>nd</sup> prize in Mimicry and Kum. Aamina Parvin got 3<sup>rd</sup> prize in Arabic Recitation. In common category we got A grade in Thiruvathira, Duffmuttu and Oppana.

## **SPORTS AND GAMES**

Along with academics, games and sports are an integral part of the school curriculum. Students are motivated and guided to be physically fit and mentally alert as a sound mind resides in a healthy body.

The sports department organized a series of inter-house indoor and outdoor events throughout the year. **Mini sports day** was conducted on 21<sup>st</sup> November. **School Sports Meet** held on 26<sup>th</sup> November, was declared open by **Sri. S. A. Madhu** (Asst. Commissioner of CGST and Customs). Homi Bhabha House emerged as winners with 572 points, while C. V. Raman House became the runners-up with 429 points.

Our Under-15 football team won the St. Francis Cup held at St. Francis Xavier School, Cheranalloor, and Master Affan Asharaf was selected as the Best Player.

The Under-15 team also became the first runner-up in the Rev. Sr. Celeisia Memorial Cup held at Jyothi Nivas Public School, Aluva, where Master Muhammed Zaman emerged as the Top Scorer.

In the Toc H Cup held at Toc H Public School, Vyttila, Master Affan Asharaf was selected as the Best Player of the tournament.

Our Under-13 team became the first runner-up in the Joe Mount Cup held at Joe Mount Public School, Chunangamvely. Master Ahlam Adam was selected as the Top Scorer, Master Aahil Asharaf as the Best Player, and Master Dhyan Krishna K. as the Best Defender.

The Under-12 team won the SSRVM Cup, in which Master Ahlam Adam was selected as the Best Player and Master Bayan Muhammed as the Promising Player.

The Under-12 team also became the first runner-up in the Viswadeepthy Cup, where Master Dhyan Krishna was selected as the Best Defender.

Our Under-13 team also became the first runner-up in the Peace Cup, and

Master Ahlam Adham was selected as the Best Player of the Match.

With immense pleasure, I would like to announce that we are continuing the Roller Skating Camp this year as well, with the participation of more than 100 students.

### **SAFAL AND OLYMPIAD EXAMINATION.**

In view of the National Education Policy 2020, which emphasizes skill-based and competency-based assessment, and NIPUN Bharat, with its commitment to improving student learning outcomes in the foundational years, CBSE has introduced a competency-based assessment to evaluate students' learning outcomes in key competencies. This proposed plan, known as SAFAL, was implemented in our school to assess the core competencies of students of Grades 5 and 8.

### **TRAINING, SEMINARS, ORIENTATION AND COUNSELLING**

Each academic year, training seminars and orientation programmes are conducted for teachers and students with a dual focus on improving and effectively implementing innovative ideas in teaching–learning practices, as well as taking students beyond their current level of learning.

The school has integrated life-skill training programmes into the academic schedule so that students develop the ability to face challenges in life. Various training sessions, career guidance programmes and seminars were conducted for students of all sections to motivate and equip them with essential skills.

Our teachers constantly strive to stay updated by attending workshops and various training programmes. Before the commencement of the academic session, orientation classes were conducted for teachers by various resource persons.

Kochi Metro Sahodaya organised many workshops on different subjects at various schools, in which most of our teachers actively participated. Teachers also regularly attended capacity-building programmes conducted by CBSE at various venues, in accordance with CBSE bylaws.

### **EXTRA ACTIVITIES 2025**

In the academic year 2025–26, Al Ameen Public School, Sreemoolanagaram, witnessed a vibrant array of activities that enriched the educational experience of our students.

To instill a sense of ecological responsibility, World Environment Day was celebrated on 5th June 2025. Activities included a special assembly, drawing and coloring, poster making, and documentary making. Various saplings were planted on the campus on

the same day.

Eid was celebrated on 9th June 2025 with colourful programmes. A mehndi competition was conducted under the guidance of the Arabic Department.

Reading Day was celebrated on 19th June by organizing various competitions such as quizzes and reading challenges.

International Yoga Day was commemorated on 21st June with yoga demonstrations and awareness talks.

On 23rd June, International Olympic Day was observed by conducting a marathon and a skit, conveying the importance of sports in daily life.

Anti-Narcotic Day was observed on 26th June with a placard-making competition to create awareness among students about the harmful effects of drugs. A street play and rally were also conducted as part of the outreach programme.

In connection with Kargil Vijay Diwas and Hindi Diwas, the Hindi Department organised various events and competitions for students.

The Malarvadi Scholarship Examination was conducted on 2nd August. Anamika Maneesh and Muhammed Ihsan of Class I, Ashmira Fathima of Class III, Shayan Ahmar of Class IV, and Ryan K. Jaijo of Class VI won prizes. Shayan Ahmar was selected for the district level.

In Freedom Quest 2025, held at Al Ameen Public School, Edappally, our school won the second runners-up trophy along with a cash prize.

Independence Day celebrations were organised by the Science and Hindi Departments, during which the national flag was hoisted by our Manager, followed by a colourful programme fostering a spirit of patriotism.

A Book Fair was conducted on 16th, 18th and 19th to encourage students to develop a reading habit.

As part of the community outreach programme, our senior students visited Buds Deepam School, Parappuram, where they spent time with the children by sharing sweets and engaging in various activities.

With the guidance of the Science, Malayalam and KG Departments, the Onam celebration “SRAVANAM” was held with great pomp and splendour. Floral decorations, tug of war, Thiruvathira, Pulikkali and Onappattukal were the highlights of the event, followed by the distribution of payasam.

To nurture scientific thinking and creativity among students, the school organizes a Science Exhibition every year. This year, it was held on 18th September with great enthusiasm.

On 27th September, the “MAMPOOVU” Scholarship Examination was conducted by the Malayalam Department. On the same day, a quiz competition organised by the Residents’ Association of Aluva and Angamaly was held, in which Master Arnav Rajesh won the second prize.

A total of 93 students from Classes VI to XII were enrolled in the Green Olympiad

Programme supported by the Ministry of Education and the Ministry of Environment, Forest and Climate Change.

In the inter-house manuscript competition, *INKSPIRE* of J. C. Bose House secured the first prize with 641 points, while *AURORA* of C. V. Raman House secured the second prize with 617 points.

In the NOOR-E-ILAH competition held at Al Ameen Public School, Edappally, Kum. Hena Khatoon Hanzal and Kum. Fayha Harshal won the third prize in PowerPoint Presentation.

Eye Screening Camps were conducted on 23rd and 25th July in association with Tony's Eye Hospital, Aluva.

As part of the community outreach programme, the inter-school kids' fest LOVEHA was conducted on 1st November, in which around 162 children participated, making it a grand success.

The KG Department commenced its activities with the celebration of Environment Day on 5th June 2025, followed by Doctor's Day, Drizzle Day, Red Day, Yellow Day, Independence Day, Fruit Salad Day and other theme-based celebrations.

Children's Day was celebrated on 14th November with the active participation of all KG students.

The 68th birthday of the State of Kerala was celebrated on 1st November with various cultural programmes on the school campus.

The school also observed Constitution Day on 26th November 2025 by conducting various awareness activities.

## **STUDY TOURS AND PICNICS**

School tours provide students with opportunities for adjustment and adaptation to life outside the comfort zones of home and school. Class-wise trips and visits were organised for all students from LKG to Class XII. These trips offered students a refreshing break from stress and strain and helped them understand different places and cultures.

## **PTA Meetings**

The school maintains a strong partnership with parents, who actively support school activities with their valuable suggestions. Regular open-house meetings ensure effective communication between teachers and parents regarding students' progress. The PTA committee met periodically and contributed to the smooth functioning of the school.

On 26th July, our students participated in TECHATHON 2025 held at Rajagiri Public School and won the third prize.

Three of our Plus Two students—Master Nikhil Dath, Nirmal Dath, and Muhammed Rayhan V. J.—reached the semifinals in Hack for Future, conducted at Saraswathy Vidyanikethan, Elamakkara.

Our school secured a position among the top five in the CBSE Science Exhibition held on 19th and 20th November.

Kumari Riya Khan, Kumari Gowri M. Nair, and Master John Paul won first prize in the KMS Innovation Festival held at Sree Sarada Vidyalaya, Kalady.

Our robotics team won second prize in SPARKATHON 2025 held at Al Ameen College, Edathala.
